Your charges are based on your council tax banding and the table below tells you what your charges are from 1st April 2010 to 31st March 2011:

Note: If your home is not connected to the public sewer, you do not have to pay the waste water collection charge. Please contact us if you are in any doubt, visit www.scottishwater.co.uk or call our **Customer Helpline** on **0845 601 8855**.

Some Council Tax exemptions/discounts continue to apply to these charges. The permanent Water Charges Reduction Scheme, a reduction of up to 25%, introduced by the Scottish Government at 1st April 2006, is applied automatically to households with 2 or more adults, which are in receipt of Council Tax Benefit and are not already in receipt of status discounts. Please note, that regardless of Council Tax Benefit status, water charges are still due and payable as per your Council Tax bill. If your property has been altered to meet the needs of a disabled person, you may be entitled to Disabled Banding Reduction on the charges you pay for your property.

Your local Council collects these charges on our behalf and details of how to pay can be found on your Council Tax bill. Please contact your local Council for further information.
